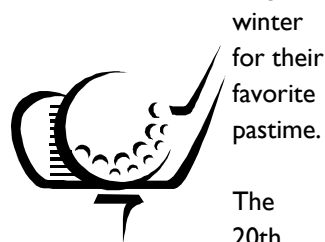

Leadership: Art or Science?

I do a lot of work in the field of leadership, both for teams and for individuals. My focus at Aurora University is also on leadership, a tremendously meaningful and popular concentration that we offer as part of our MBA Program. Of the many questions that are posed to me about leadership, the two that I hear most frequently are:

Is leadership an art or a science?

Is leadership inherent or learned?

We can't deal with both in the allotted space but I will share some thoughts on the former.

Science of Leadership

There are specific things about leadership that are intuitive and come straight from the gut. There is also a larger-than-believed pool of tools that one can use to stretch one's leadership capabilities. Let's look at the science side.

First, when it comes to leadership tools, LOADS of them are available to you. Second, if you are committed to being the best that you can be (and having your team do so, as well), then you need to commit to developing the science part of your leadership equation. Third, knowledge without action is daydreaming. You need to use the tools...and not just the same ones over and over again.

I advocate use of a virtual tool that I call the leadership tool belt. For those of you not exposed to it, this figurative belt – similar to a carpenter's tool belt - is made up solely of pouches (like the kind that hold nails, brads, etc.). Each pouch

represents a category of leadership tools. Examples include idea generation, priority setting, meetings management, time management and so forth. Each tool is intended to be available for you to use in circumstances suggesting that it will produce the most effective and efficient results. I won't repeat all that here but I do offer to give you a one-on-one primer, if you wish.

Next Step, Please?

Make a commitment to excellence by developing both the art and the science sides of your leadership persona. Experience, discussions and research will do so for the 'art' side. Development of tools will do so for the 'science' side. In point of fact, you have to be more aggressive with the latter than the former. That's because the art side can evolve without your being proactive about it. Not so with the science side.

Are you ready to take your leadership to the next level? If so, now is a good time to put together a plan of action. If you start now, you can go at a very comfortable pace and be better prepared for exciting new challenges. Remember: Challenges are the best way to measure how well your leadership vehicle is hugging the road.

These are just words...unless and until you try them out.

Community Pride Award Nominations Sought

The Village of Carol Stream established a local Community Pride award program in 2001 to recognize those local property owners for their successful efforts to beautify their home, apartment complex or business establishment. Carol Stream residential (renters) and non-residential property owners who have landscaping features or building façade improvements that enhance the streetscape image of their neighborhood, improve property values are eligible for a 2009 Community Pride award. Up to 4 awards in the commercial/industrial category exist that include 2 for landscaping and 2 for building façade. 4 general categories:

Landscaping Features Award

- ◆ Commercial – 1 award
- ◆ Industrial – 1 award

Façade Improvement Award (eligible properties must be 2 years old)

- ◆ Commercial – 1 award
- ◆ Industrial – 1 award

Winning properties will receive a framed award and a copy of the award resolution adopted by the Village Board. This year's winners will be announced and recognized at the September 21st Village Board meeting. Nomination forms are to be submitted to the Village Manager's Office by Friday, June 19th. Energy Management – Don't Wait Until it Becomes a Condition of Doing Business

Energy management, environment sustainability and climate protection are serious global issues that require urgent attention from corporate management and boards of directors. Going green is and will continue to be a national obsession with prospective clients preferring, and in many cases demanding that their vendors/suppliers have some type of environmental certification as a pre-condition for doing business.

Energy efficient programs funded through this competition include the following:

◆ **Energy Efficiency Commercial Lighting Installation** – replace energy inefficiency lighting with new ballasts and low-wattage lamps, light bulbs, LED exit signs. Companies with non-standard lighting can apply for funding for custom lighting projects.

◆ **Heating, Ventilating & Cooling Upgrade** – building/facility temperature control can account for as much as 30% of a building's annual energy use. Financial incentives are available to fund improvements in a company's HVAC system components (motors, chillers, room or system air conditioners) to save money while improving indoor air quality.



◆ **Whole Building Tune Ups (Retro-commissioning)** - do your employees complain about work spaces being too cold in the summer or too hot in the winter. If indoor air quality is a recurring problem, this program will help a company undertake a building tune up that will assess the functioning of a building's energy use systems and identify no cost and low cost energy savings recommendations to ensure temperature control is improved.

◆ **Load Response** – provides financial incentives to businesses that can voluntarily reduce their energy use during times when wholesale electricity prices are their highest. Companies that have the flexibility of using energy when it is most cost-effective can save substantial amounts of money on their operating energy costs under this program.

The program incentive year begins June 1, 2009 so times is of the essence to leverage energy efficiency funding to the benefit of your corporate bottom line. To apply for energy efficient funding from Com-Ed, visit www.comed.com/businesssavings then click on **Programs & Incentives** link.

Companies that undertake energy-efficient improvements that meet federal energy reduction thresholds in a given calendar year will qualify for additional savings from energy tax credits outlined in the Energy Policy Act of 2005. In 2005, Congress passed the Energy Policy Act which established a one-time tax deduction of up to \$1.80 per square foot is available to owners or designers of new or existing commercial buildings that save at least 50% of the heating and cooling energy of a building that meets applicable American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers standards. Partial deductions of up to 60¢ per square foot can be taken for measures affecting any one of following 3 building systems: the building envelope, lighting, or heating and cooling systems. These tax deductions are available for systems "**placed in service**" from January 1, 2006 through December 31, 2013.
